Lead Line Walk/Trot: Open to riders not yet working independently on the rail. Handler required. To be shown on the line at the walk and trot.

Ground Poles: All over fences classes to be shown at the walk and trot only. No cantering allowed over fences.

Beginning Crossrails: Open to riders just beginning to build their jumps and coursework. Outside lines only, to consist of small cross rails and ground rails; trotting permitted and encouraged. Individual or small group (2-3) canters for the flat class.

Advanced Crossrails: Crossrails and small verticals 18"-2', diagonal lines permitted. All riders to flat together (riders may be asked to perform level-appropriate flat tests - sitting trot, two-point, halt, etc.)

Novice Rider: Riders to compete at their designated height (2'0 or 2'3) with all heights judged as a whole at completion. Small, narrow oxers allowed. All riders to flat together (riders may be asked to perform level-appropriate flat tests - lengthen/shorten stride, change directions at trot, etc.)

Intermediate Rider: Riders to compete at a height of 2'6. All riders to flat together (riders may be asked to perform level-appropriate flat tests - counter canter, drop your stirrups, etc.)

Advanced Rider: Riders to compete at their designated height (2'9, 3'0, or 3'3) with all heights judged as a whole at completion. All riders to flat together (riders may be asked to perform level-appropriate flat tests - lengthen/shorten stride, drop your stirrups, etc.).

Open Jumpers: Riders to compete at their designated height (2', 2'6, or 2'9-3'0). One round each at Table 2b and Table 2c.

Working Equitation: Horse and rider to negotiate a numbered course including flat work and small obstacles (not to exceed 2' in height). To be judged on rider form, guidance of the horse, effectiveness of aids, and the ability to perform certain tests with style and precision. Using, but not limited to, USEF Equitation Tests 1-23.

TQA Showcase Medal: Riders to compete at their designated height (2', 2'6, 2'9-3'0, or 3'3) with all heights judged as a whole at completion. To be ridden over a course of a minimum of 8 obstacles, including at least one rollback and a trot fence.

Luck of the Draw: A 2-part IEA/IHSA styled class consisting of one over fences class (18"-2') and one flat class to be judged together for one set of placings. All horses entered in this class will be put into a pool and riders will draw the horse they will compete on for the class.
